### REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION & SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION

This Program, hosted by the Ohio Animal Welfare Federation, is being offered in compliance with OAC 109:2-15-02 using curriculum approved by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission. It is intended only for persons who have been approved by a county humane society to become a humane society agent, other law enforcement, or others who are associated with a law enforcement agency and have a legitimate need for this information to promote animal welfare. Students who successfully complete this Program will receive a Certificate of Completion. A Certificate of Completion for this Program does not constitute an appointment of the Student as a humane society agent. Students may only act as humane society agents after they have been:

- 1) Appointed by a <u>county humane society</u> organized under section 1717.05 of the Ohio Revised Code;
- 2) Approved by the mayor of the municipal corporation or the probate judge of the county where they intend to serve; and
- 3) Comply with all other requirements provided by law.

All participants are required to have reliable Internet access/WiFi and a web cam that is to remain on during the full course of the virtual training for verification purposes. Participants must also have access to their email to complete required quizzes at the end of each topic, which must also be completed while on camera. Finally, participants must be physically able to participate in the Subject Control Techniques training.

To earn a Certificate of Completion, Students must complete all 34 hours of training AND earn a combined score of at least 32 out of 35 total points on five topic quizzes.

**SUBJECT CONTROL TECHNIQUES:** This Humane Society Agent Training Program follows the curriculum approved by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission of 26 hours of virtual instruction plus 8 hours of in-person instruction in Subject Control Techniques. Registrants are required to participate in this <a href="https://highly.ndm.nighly.ndm

Ohio Fed will make arrangements for this training and registrants will be contacted to choose a date and location.

**AGREEMENT:** This Program is being offered in compliance with OAC 109:2-15-02 using curriculum approved by the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission. The Ohio Animal Welfare Federation (OAWF) reserves the right to reject any application. Students who successfully complete this Program, including any assessments of the Student's knowledge of the material, shall receive a Certificate of Completion. A Certificate of Completion for this Program does not constitute an appointment of the Student as a

humane society agent. Students may only act as humane society agents after they have been appointed by a county humane society organized under section 1717.05 of the Ohio Revised Code; are approved by the mayor of the municipal corporation or the probate judge of the county where they intend to serve; and comply with all other requirements provided by law.

This Program is for training and educational purposes only. Nothing in this Program, including answers provided by instructors in response to questions, shall be construed as legal advice to the Student. Students agree and understand that laws are constantly subject to change and interpretation by governmental entities and courts. Information provided in the Program is not and cannot be comprehensive, but rather serves as introductory training. The Student is responsible for following changes in the law and in court cases.

Students who do not cancel their registration within three (3) business days prior to the start of the Program will be charged a fee of one-half the total tuition. There are no refunds after the Program has begun, including for those who are not successful in completing the Program. Students who complete the virtual portion of the training but cancel their in-person Subject Control Techniques training within three (3) business days of the assigned training date will be assessed a fee (3 days in advance: 25%; between 72 and 24 hours in advance: 50%; day of/no show: 100%). These Students will be responsible for paying the full training fee when their Subject Control Techniques training is rescheduled.

Students must comply with all rules and direction provided by OAWF. Students who fail to comply with OAWF rules and directions, including rules regarding attendance, may be asked to leave the Program without a refund. OAWF will provide instruction under competent instructors and assumes no responsibility other than the opportunity to learn under supervision. Student agrees to hold OAWF, its officers, directors, employees, volunteers, agents, and instructors harmless for any harm, liability or claim whatsoever that may arise. This Program is subject to delay or cancellation. If the Program is cancelled or delayed from no fault of the Student, the Program fee shall be reimbursed in full, or may be applied to a future program, at the Student's direction. Enrollment into this Program constitutes an acceptance of this agreement and the conditions stated.
